## 2.0 Guidelines

- 1. Every candidate must submit a half-yearly progress report and present his/her progress report in a research colloquium twice a year as part of the progress monitoring in June and December.
- 2. The progress report shall indicate the achievements/milestones achieved/list of publications (if any), etc. and also include the work plan (including thesis writing plan) for the next 6 months.
- 3. Notification for PPM registration will be sent **1 months** prior to the start of the registration process to allow time for the candidate to clear outstanding fees.
- 4. A candidate who **did not register** in system is **not allowed** to present at the PG colloquium. A US grade will be given.
- 5. A newly registered candidate whose candidature period is no more than 6 months only needs to register in system to obtain a formal progress monitoring result in transcript. He/she does not need to present at the PG colloquium. A NA grade will be given.
- 6. A new candidate who has enrolled after the PPM registration deadline does not need to register in system. A <u>NA</u> grade will be given.
- 7. A candidate who has presented for Proposal Defence or Work Completion Defence no more than six months before the PG colloquium does not need to present at the colloquium. Nevertheless, the candidate is still required to REGISTER FOR PPM in system to obtain a formal progress monitoring result in transcript. A NA grade will be given.
- 8. A candidate who has **submitted** his/her **thesis** for examination is no longer needed to register for PPM. A <u>NA</u> grade will be given.
- 9. **Appeal** to present at the PG colloquium after the system registration deadline, but **before the PG colloquium**, can be made to the Dean of IPS based on **valid reasons**, with strong support from the faculty.
- 10. Appeal to present at the PG colloquium after system registration deadline and also **after the PG colloquium CANNOT be accepted**. A US grade will be given.
- 11. A candidate who has registered in system, but could not present at the PG colloquium due to valid reasons such as medical leave or conference/workshop/public event that clashes with the PG colloquium can request to reschedule the presentation, based on the discretion of the Faculty. Evidence must be submitted to supervisor(s) and Faculty R&I for records. Otherwise, a <u>US</u> grade will be given.
- 12. A candidate who is on **leave of absence** (LOA) (or had just resumed studies for no more than 3 months after the ending of the LOA) can be **exempted** from the PPM exercise. A <u>NA</u> grade will be given.
- 13. A candidate will have his candidature terminated after obtaining 3 consecutive 'US' grades (including US (BAR) and US (N-REG)).
